YOUTH MINISTRY

Boundaries and Expectations

This is part three of an eight week series of excerpts from the book, *What Kids Need to Succeed* by Peter L. Benson, PhD., Judy Galbraith, M.A., and Pamela Espeland.

"Young people need to know what is expected of them and whether activities and behaviors are 'in bounds' or 'out of bounds'. The more a child has clear, consistent boundaries and high expectations, the more likely it is that he or she will grow up healthy. Family Boundaries- Parents set clear rules and consequences for their kids' behavior. They monitor

School Boundaries- Schools set clear rules and consequences for student behavior.

their children's whereabouts.

Neighborhood Boundaries- Neighbors take responsibility for monitoring young people's behavior. Adult Role Models- Parents and other adults model positive, responsible behavior.

High Expectations- Parents and teachers encourage kids to do well."
