## YOUTH MINISTRY

### Constructive Use of Time

Our culture promotes a hectic lifestyle, so as parents, our teens need us to mentor them as they seek balance in their busy schedules. This week's excerpt from the book, *What Kids Need to Succeed*, stresses the importance of teens constructively using their time in a variety of ways. It is important for parents to remember that each teen's interests vary according to their talents and personality. Our responsibility as parents is to give them encouragement while guiding our teens in the art of balance. Teens along with their families tend to forget the importance of scheduling quality family time in the great balancing act of life. Enjoy this week's excerpt from *What Kids Need to Succeed*.

"Young people need constructive, enriching opportunities for growth through creative activities, youth programs, congregational involvement, and quality time at home. The more time a child spends with caring adults, who nurture the child's skills and creativity, the more likely it is that she or he will grow up healthy. (pg. 97)

Creative Activities Goal: To spend three or more hours per week in lessons or practice music, theater or other arts. (pg. 110)

Youth Programs Goal: To spend three or more hours per week in sports, clubs, or organizations at school and/or in the community. (pg. 111)

Religious Community goal: To spend one or more hours per week in activities in a religious institution. (pg. 112)

Time at Home goal: To spend two or fewer nights each week out with friends 'with nothing special to do'. Set limits on how often kids can go out with their friends during the school week. Encourage your children to get involved in creative activities, youth programs, and service to others. Make time at home fun for everyone. Spend time together doing things you enjoy. Play favorite games, have a family (movie) night, read, take walks or bike rides. Allow your children to invite friends on some of their 'at home' nights. Limit the amount of time your children spend at home alone. Make your home a warm and inviting place for all family members - somewhere your kids want to be." (pg. 107-108)
