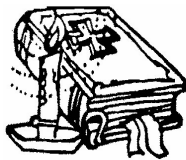

St. Francis Borgia Regional High School Open House

St. Francis Borgia Regional High School will hold an Open House on Sunday, October 25, from 12:00-2:00PM. The entire community is invited. This is an excellent opportunity for all members of the community to come in and visit and get to know more about this College Preparatory school.

Visitors to the campus will be able to see and hear a variety of demonstrations and presentations. Some of the presentations will be interactive. Visitors can try their hands at being on-air anchors in the televisions studio, or "test driving" laptop computers. School musicians will perform in the main lobby. Guided tours of the campus will be given by members of the National Honor Society and SFBRHS Ambassadors. Refreshments and door prizes will be available.

St. Francis Borgia Regional High School is an open enrollment school, which currently has an enrollment of 550 students. The average class size is 21, and the student to teacher ratio is 17:1. Sixty-six percent of the graduating class of 2009 received college scholarships worth over \$554,000, had an average ACT score of 24 and over 97% of the graduates continued on with their education.
