My thanks again to all those who helped with last week's Fall Dinner, we will hopefully have a financial report as to how we did on the dinner in next week's bulletin.

A couple of things that may be coming in the near future:

For Advent, we are thinking of having a "Pennies for the Charity" drive. We would put a large container in the vestibule of the church near the Giving Tree and from what we collect we would give 1/3 to St. Vincent de Paul, 1/3 to the Peace Pantry, an 1/3 to the Latin American Missions.

For Lent, we were thinking that perhaps we could do 3 "mini-retreats" at Il Ritiro in Dittmer. Fr. Beighlie could give one on Lenten Scriptures, Fr. Don could give one on Holy Week and the Triduum, and I would give one on the Sacraments. These would be a Friday evening thru Saturday afternoon with Mass, Confessions, 2 or 3 talks and some quiet time for prayer. I want to run all of this past the Parish Council and Liturgy committee for their input, but definite possibilities for the future.
