This weekend we have celebrated All Saints - all of those faith filled Christians who have gone before us throughout the centuries and who now share the joy of the Lord's Kingdom - and, the Feast of All Souls. Death is a reality. As Fr. Don has said to me, and perhaps to all of you, "none of us are going to get out of this alive!" But we do believe and trust that we will move from one life to another, and the rewards of that life are just simply beyond our human comprehension. There will be no more sickness or disease, suffering or pain, hunger, death or war. We will be forever with God, transformed into a new kind of existence. We await the Kingdom, and we do so not with fear, but with great hope of what will be.

In the coming days, up until the beginning of Advent, we will have placed in the Church, the Book of Remembrance. It is a reminder to us of how we are connected to those who have touched our lives and our community and have now gone to that next life. We believe that we are uniquely connected: the church militant (we on earth) with the church suffering (those awaiting the Kingdom in purgatory) with the church triumphant (those in Heaven). It is considered a good and holy thing to pray for the dead, in these final days of Ordinary Time when the Church begins directing our readings and prayer to the end times, we are challenged to remember in prayer all those faithful souls who have made our faith a reality.

Eternal rest grant unto them O Lord,
and May the Perpetual Light shine upon them.
May their souls and the souls of all the faithful departed rest in peace. Amen.
