Pastor's Notes 

Traditionally during this month of November the Church prays in a particular way for those who have gone before in faith. Last Sunday (All Saints) and again on Monday (All Souls) we read off the names of all who have been buried from here at OLQP during the past 12 months. We trust as Christians that death is not the end of everything as we know it, but rather, it is simply the doorway to an entirely new kind of life with God. John reminds us in his gospel that in His Father's house, there are many rooms, and for the faithful Christian, He has a place prepared for us. In his Revelations, John tells us that the Heavenly Jerusalem is like a bride adorned on her wedding day. It is a spectacular place beyond our imaginings.

By the end of the month we are celebrating the civil holiday of Thanksgiving, a great day to come to Church and give thanks to God for all of the blessings we may regularly take for granted. That same weekend we will go into the season of Advent, a time of quiet waiting and preparation for the coming of our God.

Preschool News



Our students have been quite busy!

The four year old classes have just returned from visiting Egypt. They learned what King Tut looked like, pyramids, and more. In the science center they located Egypt on the globe and observed different clothing that the ancient Egyptians wore. In the math center they picked a number card and placed that many pyramids in the "desert". They traced the capitol and lower case E on an Egyptian figure and made a pyramid and a mask of King Tut. For religion the students participated in the re-enactment of baby Moses, who was left in a basket in the Nile River. Our three year olds concentrated on the color green. In the science center they observed a variety of real grapes (had some for snack) and where they grow. In the math center they picked a number card and placed that number of "grapes" on a vine. In the art center the students made a grape vine complete with grapes (green pompoms). For religion the three year olds saw a puppet show that told the story about a vine and a special branch. The children learned that they are little branches that need Jesus, their Vine. We are so blessed to have these young students in our Early Childhood Educational Program that centers around Jesus' love for them. They certainly are looking forward to our Thanksgiving Prayer Service and our Thanksgiving feast. Stay tuned!
