## YOUTH MINISTRY

### Positive Identity

This is the final week of our eight part series from the book, *What Kids Need to Succeed* by Peter L. Benson, Ph.D., Judy Galbraith, M.A., and Pamela Espeland. As you can see, this book is an amazing resource for parents as they parent their children through the teen years. When we bring our newborns home from the hospital we often read parenting books and magazines to ensure we are informed as new parents. When our children grow into the teen years we might feel tempted to put on blinders, hold our breath and hope for the best. Our teens are counting on us to be informed on how to parent them through adolescence because our teens need us in a different way than when they were young. Parenting teens is an awesome and fun time in their lives and ours if we prepare our hearts, inform our minds, learn from others' wisdom while asking for God's help each and every day.

"Young people need a strong sense of their own power, purpose, worth, and promise. The more a child has a sense of power, purpose, worth, and promise, the more likely it is that she or he will grow up healthy. (195)

**Personal Power:** Kids feel that they have control over many things that happen to them. At home, help your children understand the difference between what we can and can't control. Example: We can control what we say and do; we can't control what other people say and do. (196)

**Self-Esteem:** Kids feel good about themselves. When your kids make mistakes or bad choices, separate the deed from the doer. The choice is bad, not the child. Treat your children with respect. Listen without interrupting; talk without yelling. (199)

**Sense of purpose:** Kids believe that their life has a purpose. Give your children opportunities to find meaning in ways that are consistent with your family's values. This might involve religious activities, political involvement, service, or other pursuits. (202-203)

**Positive View of Personal Future:** Kids are optimistic about their own future. Inspire hope by being hopeful, optimism by being optimistic. Look forward to your future and the future of your family with joyful anticipation. Don't dismiss your children's dreams as naïve or unrealistic. Instead, encourage them to tell you their dreams. Share in their enthusiasm. (205)"
