Last weekend, I warned you that if I were to print something here "From the Desk of Fr. Beighlie," it was likely to be some scrap of paper with a note whose meaning even I have forgotten. This week I found a scrap of paper that I believe is worth sharing with you. Nine of our 7th grade girls are planning a Box City Event to raise awareness about homelessness. Here is what one of the girls has written about why she wants to be a part of this project:

"When we read about those people in the box city, we all thought it would be really cool to do something like that. We were told that lots of people were living on the streets. As I thought about what Fr. Beighlie said, it dawned on me that these people really needed our help. I want to help raise enough money to help some homeless people get money for food.

"We also learned that many people die of starvation every day. I just think that is really sad and it makes me want to do something about it. If we don't do anything for these people they will all die out and if you were homeless you wouldn't want to be overlooked like a piece of trash.

"I strongly feel that if we help the unfortunate, our lives will feel full of love for all. If we all give a little of our hearts to those who need it, I think we will be on the road to a better life. If we help the homeless to make their lives better, ours will definitely be happier and holier. I think that we are educated enough and prepared enough to go out and make the world a better place for all - even if we just spread the love in Missouri. So please give the tiniest bit of your heart to the homeless.

"I am not doing this for my own image. I really feel bad for these people. I am doing this project for all the people in the U.S. and everywhere else - people who roam the streets in order to survive. If you think about it, it is really sad and depressing that these people don't have homes to go to. Sometimes we just take that for granted. I hope our project is a success because I really want to help these people. If we succeed, I think we will feel a lot better about what we did for them."

## YOUTH MINISTRY

### Commitment to Learning

In this week's selection from the book *What Kids Need to Succeed* the focus is on internal assets that help young people chose goodness over selfishness. We are very blessed here at our parish because we have so many teens that care about the world and their community. Many of them are trying to be the best they can be so they can make the world a better place. Having a commitment to learning is evident in their lives.

"Young people need to develop a lifelong commitment to education and learning. The more committed a child is to learning, the more likely it is that he or she will grow up healthy. (pg. 117)

Achievement motivation: Clearly communicate to your children that you value learning - that you think school is important, and you want them to take it seriously. (pg. 118)

School engagement: Kids are actively engaged in learning. Talk with your children about school and learning. Ask them every day what they did in school, what they learned, what they liked about school, what they didn't like about it. Stay in touch with their school experience. (pg. 121)

Homework: Kids do at least one hour of homework every school day. Provide a quiet, comfortable, well-lit place for kids to study without distractions. (pg. 125)

Bonding to school: Kids care about their school. Part of bonding to school involves knowing that someone in school cares about you. Tell your child about one adult and one peer in your school who cared about you. Ask your child which adult and which friends he or she likes best in school and why. (pg. 128)

Reading for pleasure: Kids read for pleasure three or more hours per week. Model reading for pleasure. Talk with your children about what your reading; make your enthusiasm for

reading obvious to them. (pg. 131)

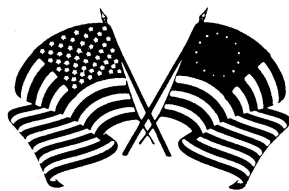
