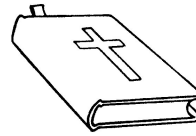

In Luke's view the glorification of Jesus ushered in a new era. Just as God formed a covenant community with the Jewish people at Sinai, so now he is about to form a new people on the anniversary of that event - Pentecost. Just as Luke told us that Jesus was "at prayer" when the Spirit descended upon him at his Baptism to give him power for his mission, so now the community is at prayer as they await the coming of the Holy Spirit. In the Gospel Jesus entrusts to his followers the message God entrusted to him. Because it will not be easy to carry this message to a hostile world, Jesus prays in a special way for his disciples. He will live on in them, present to the world in a unique and special way.

**Life Focus:** Recall your earliest introductions to prayer. Who was the focal point of the prayer? How do your prayers differ today? How do you pray best? What do you need?

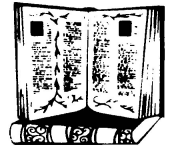
## RCIA
