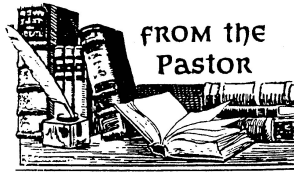

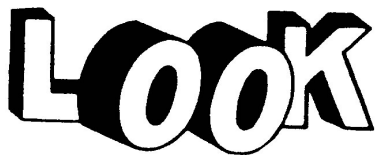
**St. Vincent De Paul**

### Preschool's Pen

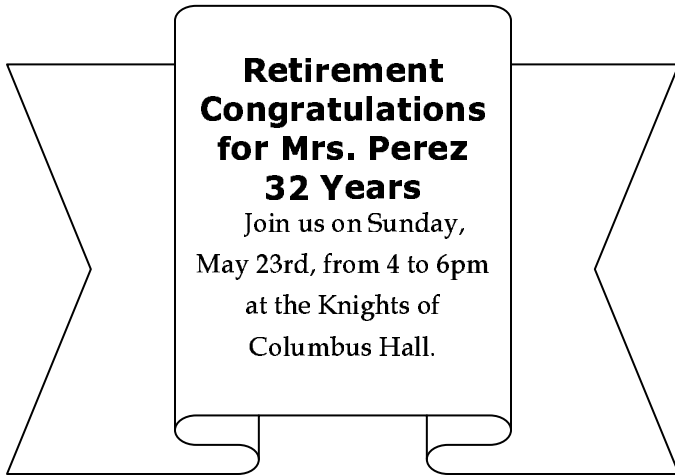
