- First Reading Hosea 6:3-6
- Second Reading..... Romans 4:18-25
- Gospel Matthew 9:9-13

Today's Gospel shows Jesus being rejected by some of the Pharisees. Caught up in observing the law to the letter, they fail to see the generosity of God's love shown by Jesus. Jesus asked Matthew, a customs collector, to follow him. This man was regarded as a sinner by the Jews and someone to be avoided and scorned. God's mercy is not held from those who appear to be unworthy. In fact, it is precisely to these that God's love reaches out. People are saved by God's graciousness, not by their own efforts or accomplishments. Observance of the law without love for others is not genuine religion.

Life Focus: How have you let the law, not love, become a priority in your spiritual life? State a time when you closed your mind to Jesus' compassion through your prejudices, hatred or selfishness.
