Blood Facts...

- ◆ On any given day, an average of 38,000 units of red blood cells are needed for hospital patients in the United States.
- ◆ One in 10 people entering a hospital needs blood.
- ◆ Nearly 60 percent of the population is eligible to give blood, however only about 5 percent actually donate.
- ◆ In the United States, someone needs a blood transfusion about every 2 seconds.
- ◆ The average body contains 10 - 12 pints of blood. A newborn baby has about one cup of blood in his or her body.
- ◆ There are about one billion red blood cells in two to three drops of blood.
- ◆ Red blood cells must be transfused within 42 days.
- ◆ There is no substitute for human blood. It cannot be manufactured.
- ◆ Almost everyone will know someone who needs blood.
- ◆ Blood is often needed for traumas, heart surgeries, joint-replacement surgeries, organ transplants, premature babies, leukemia and cancer treatments and much more.
- ◆ People in car accidents who suffer massive blood loss may require transfusions of more than 50 pints of red blood cells.

Trinity Sunday

Cycle A

**THEME: "We are loved."**

The Feast of the Holy Trinity is probably the most challenging day to preach God's word. The Trinity is the most profound mystery of the Christian faith. We believe in one God in three persons. All theology moves by way of analogy and a workable analogy for the Trinity is that of a flame. In a flame there is heat, but heat is not the flame; there is light, but light is not the flame; there is combustion, the consumption of oxygen and the production of by-products, but combustion is not the flame. There is one flame, yet there is no flame without energy (combustion), heat, and light. And, as is the case with all analogies, an analogy limps; it approximates what it tries to describe without fully capturing its essence.

Perhaps we can do better if we approach the Trinity in terms of spirituality and how we relate to each of the three persons. We name the first person of the Trinity "Father." We turn to the creating God whom we name "Father" for care, support, for imparting a sense of belonging in the sense of family ties, for the

knowledge that, no matter what, we are loved. We name the second person of the Trinity "Son." We approach Jesus as a brother, as a companion along the way, as that person with whom we share our sonship, as that person who strengthens us in weakness and guides us in living as sons and daughters of a common Father. We name the third person of the Trinity "Holy Spirit," that sense of life and knowledge and wisdom that forms us. Karl Rahner described the Holy Spirit as that bond of love that proceeds from the unity of the Father and the Son. It is this love that fills us and to whom we turn for guidance and wisdom in living as brothers and sisters of Jesus Christ and sons and daughters of the Father.

Trinitarian theology developed in time within the Christian community. Attempts at describing an understanding of God as He is in Himself are the product of theological thinking in post-biblical times. As the Christology of the New Testament is a functional Christology, an attempt at understanding who Jesus Christ is for us, so Trinitarian references in the words of Scripture are attempts at understanding who our revealing God is for us and how we relate to each other.

FIRST READING: Exodus 34:4-6, 8-9

The first reading for Trinity Sunday is from the Book of Exodus. This reading speak to the essential confession of Israel's faith. Though a stiff-necked people, though a people who broke faith at the very time and place of entering into their special, covenant relationship with God, they could believe and trust enough to call on that God to forgive and accept them. The essential image of God, for them, is that of a loving Father, a father who disciplines recalcitrant children, but never ceases to love them.

SECOND READING: II Corinthians 13:11-13

The second reading is taken from the final greetings of Paul to the people of Corinth at the close of his second letter. Corinth, in many ways was a thorn in Paul's side. He had devoted himself to the community and, as he moved on in his missionary journeys, he found that the community was torn apart by divisions and disagreements, that the community was missing the point, missing what it meant to be the community of faith. After dealing with their problems, Paul offers his hope and prayer – that the grace of Jesus Christ, the good things available to the community through the continuing mission of Jesus in the world, that the love of the Father, the love that makes us God's children and brothers and sisters of each other, the love of a Father God that will not abandon us whatever we do, and that the communion, the fellowship, the unity of all in God that comes through the Holy Spirit will be the hallmarks of our community

GOSPEL READING: John 3:16-18

The Gospel reading from John sums up John's theology of the mission of Jesus. He is the revelation of God's love, of God himself to us. Our relationship with God is characterized by this love, a love so great that God himself sacrifices for our sake. He gives of himself – that is the Spirit of God, a gift of himself for our good. That spirit, given by the Father, is carried to us in the sacrifice of the Son. We are children of a loving Father; the very spirit of God, in his Son, the gift of himself is love. Maybe we can say no more as we enter back into our time, than to affirm the profound belief, "We are loved."

FOR REFLECTION:

- What is my image of God the Father? How do I relate to God as Father? What are the implications of acclaiming God as our Father for my relationships with others? Do I live those implications?
- What is my image of God the Son? How do I relate to God as Son and brother? What are the implications of acclaiming God as our brother for my relationships with others? Do I live those implications?
- What is my image of God as Spirit? How do I relate to God as Spirit? What are the implications of acclaiming God as Holy Spirit for my relationships with others? Do I live those implications?
- What does it mean to me to affirm that I am loved by God - no matter what? Can I accept that love? Do I judge myself in harsher terms than God judges me?
- In my relationship with God, do I relate more easily to the Father, the Son, or the Spirit? Why? Are there times when one image of God more characterizes my relationship with God than the others?
