YOUTH MINISTRY

Patience is a Virtue

As parents, the summer months afford us more opportunities to spend extra family time. When we spend more time building relationships with our teens we will also need to see patience as a virtue. It helps if we realize that our teens are also trying to be patient with us as we are trying to be patient with them. If we are angry with our teens they will probably respond with anger. If we are loving and patient with our teen children while setting clear boundaries and expectations it will be easier for them to respond to our love.

If you would like a great book to read this summer, try "The Power of Kindness" by Piero Ferrucci. In the chapter on patience he writes, "I am convinced that if we practice patience, we come to understand profound aspects of other people's lives. We understand their rhythms and their weaknesses, thereby knowing their nature intimately. Also, patience is the virtue of all good teachers (and parents), who know how to wait for the pupil (child) slowly to mature, instead of pushing him before he is ready. If we rush we may lose ourselves. But we are so used to hurrying that we do not notice the loss." (pg. 138)

Slow down and take time to appreciate your children as unique and wonderful gifts from God while remembering that patience is a virtue.
