From the Pastor

Ladies Auxiliary

I was very happy last week to accept the gift of a chasuble and a pall that was commissioned by the Ladies Auxiliary and donated to our parish. A pall is the white cloth that is placed over a casket during funeral Masses and the chasuble is the outer garment that a priest wears while celebrating Mass. The design of these two items matches two chasubles that we already have so now Fr. Don, Fr. Jim and I will look like triplets.

The Ladies Auxiliary is a "support group" for the Knights of Columbus. Their main function is to SUPPORT the men and the council. They do this primarily by providing help at events, cooking for events and providing monetary help. They also help with setting up and beautifying the hall for events and managing the kitchen every Friday during Bingo. The Ladies contribute to our parish in various ways including providing a partial scholarship for selected 8th graders at graduation.

It was very fitting (although sad) that the very first use of the pall and chasuble was at Ray Brune's funeral on Thursday. Ray was a long time member of the Knights of Columbus and managed the KC Hall for over twenty years. His wife, Lillian, is an active member of the Ladies Auxiliary and helped commission the pall and chasuble long before she ever knew that the first use of them would be at her husband's funeral.

I want to thank the Ladies Auxiliary for their gift to the parish and for all the work that they do that so often goes unnoticed. They do not have swords and hats with feathers, but their work behind the scenes is greatly appreciated. Thank You!! (And please keep the Brune family in your prayers.)

Good nutrition is important in everyone's life, especially to a blood donor, and iron is a major ingredient to good nutrition. At the blood collection site, your blood will be checked to determine if your red blood cells are adequate for donation. Red Cross iron level requirements are followed to make sure you can spare a pint of blood. The requirements also mean each patient receives an iron rich transfusion.

Iron rich foods: Red meat, oysters, clams, soybeans, dried beans, peas and lentils, whole grain cereals and breads, as well as prunes and dried fruits, are excellent sources of iron.

Body and Blood of Christ
Cycle A



THEME: Remember!

Remember. Robert Fulghum (*Everything I Need to Know I Learned in Kindergarten*) once said that he was not often aware that he was happy, but that he could easily remember times when he had been happy. We often get caught up in all the busy-ness of day to day life and don't appreciate the present moment until we have time to reflect on it and remember it later. Memory is a food for the soul, a gift that makes all those moments in our lives that energize and move us alive again. On the Feast of the Body and Blood of Christ, we move again firmly into the season of Ordinary Time and we move into our time with our memories – our memories of the Lenten and Easter seasons just past, our memories of what Jesus Christ accomplished for us. The Eucharist is about memory, about making alive again the fullness

of Christ's love for us, remembering the unity we share as we gather at Christ's table.

THE READINGS:

FIRST READING: Deuteronomy 8:2-3, 14-16

The first reading is taken from Deuteronomy. Deuteronomy, in its context in the Torah, is a book that looks backwards and forwards. It is presented as four speeches of Moses to the people as they ready themselves to move into the Promised Land and live the covenant they have entered into with their God. But as the people are called to look ahead, Moses calls on them to remember, to remember God's favor and care in the past, to remember what it is that makes them who they are, where they have come from and to live who they are and their special relationship with God as they move into their future.

SECOND READING: I Corinthians 10:16-17

The second, very brief reading is taken from Paul's First Letter to the Corinthians. One of the chief difficulties Paul had to deal with in the Corinthian community was the problem of divisions, divisions based on factions adhering to different teachers or promoting different ways of looking at the Christian message. For Paul, the answer to the dilemma was simple. There is one cup and one bread that we share, the Body and Blood of Christ and because of this one meal, all who share in it are united, all are one. That is what the paschal mystery was all about – Christ's sacrifice for us, making us all one and opening for us the way to share eternal life with Him. That is what, in our time, we are called to remember and live. That remembrance is what makes us who we are.

GOSPEL READING: John 6:51-58

The dual focus of the readings, the dual focus of the feast continues in the Gospel reading from John. In essence, Jesus tells the Jews to remember what was to be able to live into what can be. There is a consistency in God's dealings with His people. He acted in the past to give them life, but to remind them that it was on the care of God that their lives depended. The same is true, but now that offer of life goes beyond surviving in the desert, goes beyond the formation of a Chosen People, to a full unity with God, a life with God that last forever. Entry into that life begins now, begins with the meal we share, with the life given to us by Jesus and what He accomplished.

We take up our journey again, not the journey of looking for the coming of Christ into our lives (Advent/Christmas), not the journey with Christ to Calvary and the possibilities of life that His death and resurrection offer us (Lent/Easter), but our journey to make something of our lives, to build the kingdom, to remember our gifts and live them. On this journey we remember and that memory makes us alive.

FOR REFLECTION:

- What memories do I cherish? What moments in life do I remember that give me life and hope in my life right now?
- Why is it so hard to be aware of the happy or significant moments in life when they occur?
- What are the moments in my life that I remember when God was particularly present for me? How does remembering these moments give me hope?
- In a world filled with diversity, in a Church filled with different ways of expressing faith, in a local believing community made up of diverse people with diverse gifts and talents, can I affirm that sharing in the Eucharist makes us one? Am I really one with people who live and express themselves in ways different from me?
- When I gather with my fellow parishioners to celebrate the Eucharist, what is it that I remember? Do my memories lead me to celebrate privately or draw me into fuller unity with my community?

Have you Lost Dishes?
