## YOUTH MINISTRY

### A Voice for God

Last Sunday, Fr. Beighlie's homily challenged us to be open to "prophetic" messages coming from our teen children. This Sunday's first reading is from the Book of Amos. Amos is a prophet that is called by God to prophesy to Israel. Amos was just doing his job as a shepherd when God called him to be a voice to His people. Because Amos was "just a shepherd" without a resume, the leadership of the time didn't appreciate the possibility of Amos being a voice for God. As parents, we can also forget to appreciate the possibility of our teen being a voice for God to our family. In Fr. Bieghlie's homily last Sunday, he shared a story about one of his former students who spoke a prophetic message about kindness to her family and how at first they did not listen to her. She did not give up easily and due to her persistence and compassion she was finally heard. The entire family became more compassionate because of her insight. I took Fr.'s challenge to look at the prophetic gifts of my teen children and I grew in insight and wisdom this past week.

One huge lesson I learned this week was the difference between "loved" and "spoiled". One morning as I was sipping my coffee on my deck enjoying the birds' amazing songs my son came out and we had a five minute conversation on the difference between what it means to spoil our dog Daisy and to love her. He said we do things out of love because it is good for the other person or in this case, our dog Daisy, but when we spoil someone we do it because it makes us feel good. Wow, that gave me food for thought the entire week. I suddenly started looking at all the things I do all week long in a different light. Enjoy letting God inspire you through your children.
