The readings for next Sunday, August 10, are:
First Reading..... 1 Kings 19:9, 11-13
Second Reading Romans 9:1-5
Gospel Matthew 14:22-33

Part of the purpose for this Gospel passage was to encourage the community. This account was written fifty years after the Resurrection event. Matthew's audience is suffering opposition, rejection, even persecution. They are beginning to worry that the risen Lord has abandoned them as well. Here Jesus reassures his followers, telling them not to be afraid. Matthew gives special attention to Peter's attempt to walk on water. Peter often acted impulsively. He came to realize his weakness and his need to rely on the Lord for help. Matthew hopes his listeners will come to the same recognition.

Life Focus: Relate an experience when you trusted at first but later began to lose faith. When has fear overcome trust in your life?

Latin America Apostolate Collection

Dear Friends in Christ,

Since 1956 the Latin America Apostolate of the Archdiocese of Saint Louis has been a most special missionary endeavor. Due to the shortage of native priests, priests of the Archdiocese of Saint Louis have served in Latin America, beginning in La Paz, Bolivia and continuing there, as well as in Belize, Central America.

Last year, His Holiness, Pope Benedict XVI, attended the historic gathering of the Latin America Bishops' Conference in Aparecida, Brazil. The theme was "Making Missionary Disciples." Pope Benedict XVI approved this document known as Aparecida. The heart of missionary work is making disciples of our Lord Jesus Christ, who, in turn, become His missionaries.

This is what our Saint Louis Priest Missionaries have been doing in Latin America. They rely on our prayers and support without which their presence and ministry cannot continue.

In the Parish of Maria Reina, Father Patrick Hayden, Father Brian Fischer and Father James Michler minister to 90,000 people within the 14 neighborhoods that cover a wide area in the city of La Paz, Bolivia. In one of the neighborhoods, our priests have plans to construct a chapel where Mass is presently celebrated in the open air. Our contributions will help this goal be attained.

While the primary duties of the priests are to proclaim the Gospel and celebrate the sacraments, they cannot ignore the suffering of the people. Due to great poverty, many suffer from disease and malnutrition. The health clinic of Maria Reina provides food, medicine, medical and dental care.

Our Saint Louis Priest Missionaries also take turns celebrating the sacraments in the parish of Santiago among the Aymara people in Calamarca. Due to the shortage of native clergy, there is no resident priest. Access to the Mass is possible thanks to our Missionaries.

The collection for the Latin America Apostolate also supports the ministry of Bishop Morgan Casey in the Vicariate of the Pando in Northwest Bolivia, as well as the ministry of Father Kevin Hederman in the diocese of Belize City, Belmopan in Central America.

I ask you to be generous in your prayers and sacrificial offering in the special collection for the Latin America Apostolate. Our response enables our Saint Louis Priest Missionaries in Latin America to continue to make "Missionary Disciples" of Our Lord Jesus Christ.

May the Lord continue to bless you, your families and your homes.
