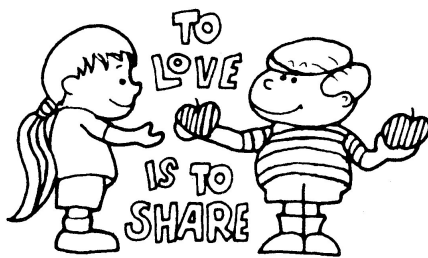

Parish Corner RCIA

The R.C.I.A. (Rite of Christian Initiation for Adults) program here at Our Lady Queen of Peace, is the process used to instruct and prepare, those who seek to join the Catholic Faith, and become part of our Parish Family. The process begins in August and culminates with the Catechumens, those who have never been baptized, receiving the Sacraments of Baptism, Confirmation, and Eucharist during the celebration of the Holy Saturday Liturgy. Those who may have been Baptized in another Faith, they are called Candidates, receive Confirmation and Eucharist with the Catechumens on Holy Saturday.

We meet in the Field House every Monday evening at 7:00pm, except Labor Day and the Monday between Christmas and New Years. Everyone is welcome to attend any of the classes. If you're interested in refreshing your knowledge of the Catholic Faith, you are welcome to pick and choose those classes that may interest you. The class topics to be discussed on which Mondays, are listed on the OLQP (olqpparish.org) web site. You can also download the information we will be discussing from the topics listed that are underlined. (Thank You Fr Beighlie)

If you know of someone who may be interested in joining the Church, or someone who is just trying to find out something more about the Church, there are no commitments required, let them know about our RCIA program. If you are interested in helping us in the RCIA program, WE NEED YOU!

The Needs Vary:

You just need to be that friend who is there to make the journey more comfortable, show them around the parish, make them feel at home.
