YOUTH MINISTRY

Do You Listen with Both Ears

How do you listen to your teen? Are you multitasking or thinking of your agenda for the day when you are "listening" to your teen? Most of us live a very, very busy lifestyle and have more "to do" than there is time in the day. Slowing down to listen to your teen with both ears doesn't only help improve communication but it will also give you a wonderful opportunity to build a stronger relationship with your teen.

Listening with both ears entails listening with an ear for information and an ear for understanding. It also involves good eye contact when your child is speaking. Try not to interrupt when they are speaking and don't change the subject to your agenda. Your only agenda should be to listen and show you are enjoying spending time with your teen. It is good to respond with empathy after they have finished sharing.

Schedule a special time in each week to spend one on one time listening to each individual child share about their life. Discover what kind of environment helps your teen to relax and feel comfortable with you. Some teens love to go out to eat, some like the outdoors, while others might feel comfortable talking with you while you enjoy a walk together. Taking time to find out what your teen might enjoy validates the importance you have placed on trying to build good communication.

Enjoy the priceless gift of listening with both ears while building a stronger relationship with your teen.
